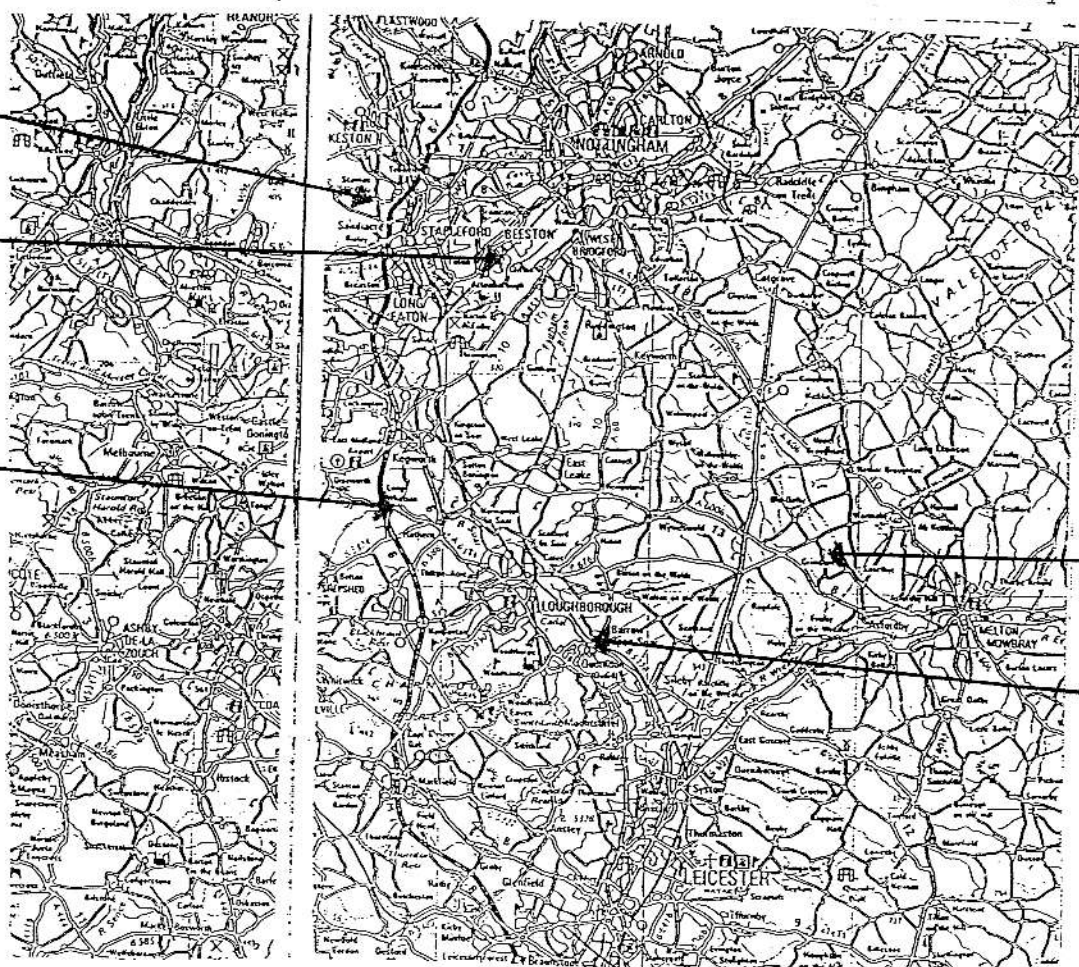

● "We are not jailing you for eating people, but for practising sorcery," the head of a judicial tribunal told three women in Bondoukou, Ivory Coast, while passing sentence. "You have said you are very very sorry, but practising sorcery is an established offence, so we are sending you to prison for a year."

Earlier, Yaoua Agninoua, Kossia Mize, and Koffi Mouroufie had confessed to eating a total of thirty-five people. "First of all, we transformed ourselves into birds on the orders of the chief," they said, "and we flew into the rooms of our victims through open windows, by night while they were asleep. Then we transformed the victims into grasscutters [large rodents], carried them home in our beaks, cooked them in a pot, and ate them. They were delicious."

The women were jailed under Article 204 of Ivory Coast's penal code, which forbids creating a public nuisance.

● "It is quite horrible picking them up sometimes," confessed 3-D technician Peggy Atherton, "because they are smelly and bloody. Sometimes it is even hard to tell what species they were before they got flattened. I like the ones that are quite squashed, quite abstract."

Atherton, who works at the Harrow Campus, was talking to reporters about her artistic speciality. "My still life work begins with collecting dead animals from the roadside. I dip their bodies in porcelain, then cremate them in the kiln until the flesh and skin burn away. When only the bones remain, they turn into bone china. Then I take the finished piece back to the place where I found the body, and leave it there. They usually get stolen within minutes."

● "I opened my eyes in hospital, and now I have to lie here with broken ribs for six weeks without moving," lamented Max Dadeshevily from his bed on an orthopaedic ward in Ichilov, Tel Aviv. "I'm not angry with the guy, but I can't understand why he had to jump on my god damned neck. OK. He wants to die, fine. So he

jumps, and nothing happens to him. I want to live, and now I'll be crippled for life."

Max, 26, a clerk in a local clinic, was speaking after hearing a full explanation from police of what had happened to him on Saturday night. "I'd gone out with my sister and five friends to see Evita, but we couldn't get tickets for the film, so we sat in a cafe in the lobby of the Opera tower, drinking, eating, and laughing. Meanwhile, this old guy of seventy-two has acute depression and decides to commit

suicide, so he takes the escalator to the third floor of the tower, shouts 'everybody wants to go to heaven but nobody wants to die — but not me!' and jumps head first into the lobby. I'm enjoying a Pimms, leaning back in my chair, when all of a sudden a suicide case falls on me from nowhere. I'm unconscious and being rushed to hospital, while he just gets up, realises he's not dead, and walks off unharmed. Thank you God."

Police later confirmed that an unnamed elderly man had been apprehended, and will be prosecuted for negligence.

○ "Mister robbers, you have cleaned us out. Please do not visit us anymore. It is not worth your while. You have already taken everything of value."

Thus began an ad in a Mexican Sunday newspaper, placed there by the Robles

family of Guanajuato. "You robbed us three times in December. First you took our television set and our VCR, then our jewellery, computers, ironing board and bread bin. Next time, you had all our curtains, a complete lavatory, and our shower fittings. Finally you took our cooker, our refrigerator and, God help us, all our chickens, then you returned the next day to have away their coop. So we had to start going out to eat. But that was not enough for you. No, it was not. On December 27th, you staged a hold-up at our local restaurant, and stole all our cash, credit cards, and my wife's necklace, earrings, and wig. You even took our half-eaten hamburgers."

"Your work is now done. Please leave us alone, if only for six months, until we have something new worth stealing."

Contraceptives have been

popping up in the most unlikely places. In Germany, two men robbed a bank with condoms over their heads instead of stockings.

"They were ribbed ones," commented the bank's manager, "for extra sensation." Still more bizarre were events in Brazil, where a man squeezed his entire body inside a Durex. Trouble started when businessman Juan Crello, 51, of Rio, bet his Mercedes that no one in the bar where he was drinking could get themselves inside a condom.

"Several people tried," recalled Mr Crello. "But no one even got near." No one, that is, until midget Anton Viperros stepped forward, stripping naked and rubbing himself with butter before beginning the challenge. "It was incredible," said one observer. "He got his head in, and his arms, and then gradually pulled it right down to his feet. He looked like a big, hairy penis." Mr Crello was forced to concede defeat and grudgingly handed over the keys to his car. "God knows what he's going to do with it," he opined. "His feet couldn't even reach the pedals."

It's all been going horribly wrong for campers. In Yorkshire, a man was seriously injured after his tent slid off the cliff top on which he'd pitched it. Equally disastrous were the experiences of American Casper Muffin, probably the most unfortunate camper of all time. Mr Muffin, 53, of Pocatello, had gone camping to "access my inner self". From the outset, however, things went wrong. "I borrowed a tent," he explained. "But it didn't seem to have a door, so I had to erect it with me inside, and then take it down whenever I wanted to get out, which was a nuisance because I wee a lot." On the first night his Primus stove exploded, setting light to his sleeping bag, while he had to move his tent nine times because skunks kept breaking wind beside it. He was eventually forced to call rescue services on his mobile phone when bears surrounded his camp, whereupon he was almost killed when a helicopter inadvertently landed on his tent. "I heard my inner voice," admitted Mr Muffin, "And it said 'Bugger camping!'"

It's been a week of chronically bungled rescue attempts. In Sri Lanka two lifeguards drowned trying to save a swimmer who wasn't even in trouble in the first place. "I was just waving to my wife," he explained. In Colombia, pilot Luis Iglesias became the subject of probably the most

inept rescue mission ever launched.

Emergency services had swung into action after Mr Iglesias' plane had crashed in mountains in the south of the country. From the outset, however, nothing went right. Two weeks were spent looking in the wrong mountains, and when efforts were eventually concentrated in the correct place the rescuers themselves had to be rescued after three of them were attacked by wild pigs. Even when Mr Iglesias was discovered problems continued - the luckless pilot, while being made comfortable on a stretcher, was somehow pushed out of the helicopter in which he was travelling. His whereabouts remain unknown. "We're trying to locate him," said one rescuer. "Although after what's happened he probably doesn't want to be found."

Weddings are, as a rule, happy affairs. Such was not the case, however, for a Huddersfield couple whose marriage was declared void because the service was conducted by a teenager on work experience. Neither was it a particularly enjoyable occasion for Italian Jero Mallini and bride Andrea, whose wedding was spoilt by a priest in suspenders. From the outset it was evident that Father Cardello was a couple of cassocks short of a pulpit. "He smelt of alcohol," recalled Mr Mallini. "And during the oaths said: 'Do you, Jero Paulo Mallini, take this big-nosed hog to be your lawfully wedded haddock'. It was terrible." Things went from bad to worse when the priest referred to Mr Mallini as "Limpus Dickus" before lifting his cassock to reveal fishnet stockings and tight ladies' knickers. Only when he started

doing the cancan did the shocked couple realise he was in fact a priestogram organised by best man Pedro Allosa. "I had it coming," admitted Mr Mallini. "When Pedro got married we replaced the altar boys with inflatable women and set off stink bombs in the vestry."

A VIDEO recorder has been diagnosed as suffering from too much smoking. Its 20-a-day owner, who complained that the machine kept going wrong, was told that it was suffering from nicotine contamination.

Wendy Green bought the machine in March 1995 and has spent £324 on repairs, replacing damaged tape-heads three times. When she complained to the manufacturers after the fourth breakdown, their engineers took it away for examination.

Company chiefs wrote to her to say there was no manufacturing fault, but they had found the problem - nicotine contamination was wearing down the heads. A spokesman for manufacturers JVC said: "Nicotine deposits inside the machine have caused excessive drag on tapes, wearing down the heads."

Mrs Green, 53, of Beeston, Nottinghamshire, said: "I have never heard of smoking damaging the health of a video recorder."

"I was almost laughed out of the shops when I was looking for a new one and asked them if my smoking would affect it. They have never heard of it before."

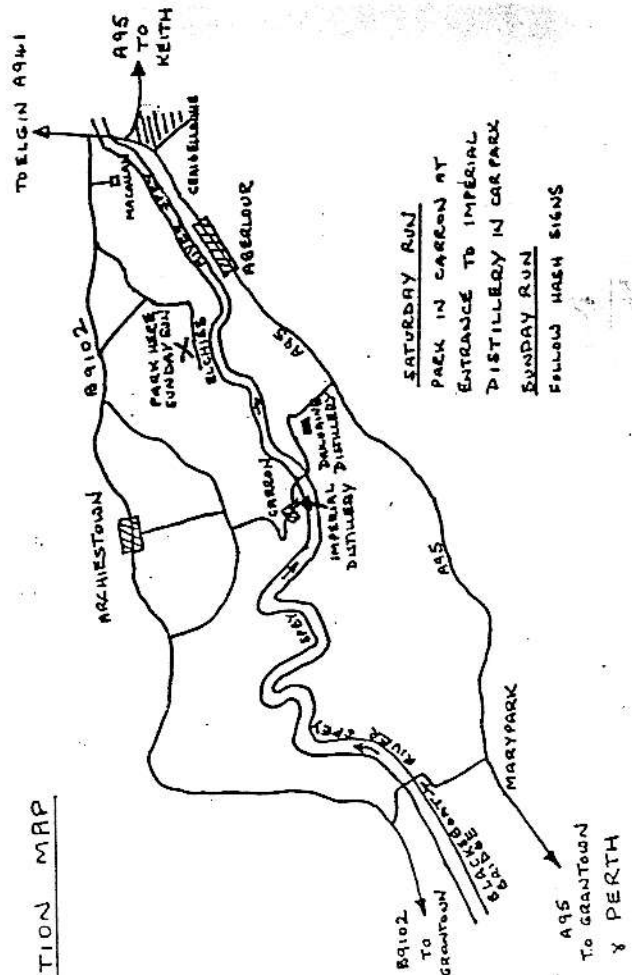

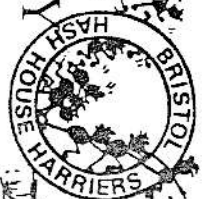

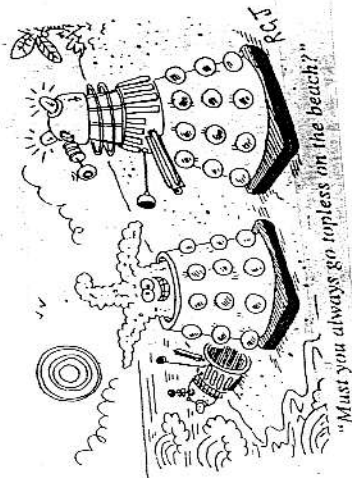
doing about miners," said governor McPip, "but I refused. I'm not a fool."
