So the doc takes a few minutes to think a little longer. He inquires, "Do you have any hobbies or a social life?"





Edale Weekend

(Sat 5th – Sun 6th June)

Overview:

The plan is to meet at 7pm Saturday evening in the Nag's Head at Edale (well, actually it's at Grindsbrook Booth – but nobody would know where that is...) and run a 4 - 5 mile (in the valley) Hash. We will then round off the evening in traditional **Hash Fashion** in the Nags and camp on Cooper's field (about 50 m from the pub).

On Sunday there will be a major Hash around the hill and moors. It is expected that this Hash will be around 10 to 14 miles long over some seriously rough country. There will be rocks, bogs, stream crossings and bogs.

SAFETY

The moors, hills and peat bogs above Edale are serious – even in summer they can turn nasty – and certain requirements will have to be met if you wish to take part in the Sunday Hash:

The hashers will be organised into groups according to estimated speed (Front Running Bastards, The Pack and Tail End Charlies).

Each group will have at least one person with experience of this sort of terrain using map / compass navigation.

Members of a group will keep in contact with each other.

Each group will carry the following communal equipment:

1. Medical kit.
2. Compass.
3. Map.
4. Bivvy bag.
5. Sleeping bag.

Each member of the group will carry (or wear) the following personal kit in *addition* to normal running gear:

1. Waterproof / windproof jacket with hood (or hat).
2. Waterproof / windproof trousers.
3. Food for 24 hours.
4. Fleece (or similar) jacket or pullover.

Other Information:

(Note that the information given below is believed to be correct as of now – I will be doing a recce in a few weeks and will update this page with a few facts and figures then)

The Nag's Head and (lower down the valley) **The Jolly Rambler** are both decent pubs selling good beer and filling pub meals. I believe that the Ramblers has some accommodation and that the Nags has a couple of attached cottages.

Cooper's campsite is 50 m from the Nags and is pretty good with clean toilets and showers. The ground is a little rough, is generally on a slight slope and can be rather muddy – in which case cars are not allowed beyond the track. Booking is advisable on summer weekends – see this page for details later in the year.

The Post Office is also a general provisions store and is between Coopers and the Nags.

The National Park Campsite and Visitor Centre I don't know much about. The only thing I *do* know is that the campsite is always booked up.

The Café near the station is good.

The Railway Station is served by trains from Sheffield and Manchester.

There is a **pay and display car park** at the bottom of the Grindsbrook valley – about ¾ mile from the Nags.

Mobile phones work on some of the high points but not in the Edale valley.
