

Inside you will find the stats for the last five years, plus the Pub Popularity Parade, the Superlatives and a full list of runs for 1997 (corrected - sorry Rockhopper!) All stats run up to and including Run no. 231. I haven't included future pubs unlike last year, as venues have a habit of changing! In the case of A to B runs, B is counted, not A (i.e. where the trail actually ends). For individual stats (which start at Run no. 91, when I joined QH3), the number of Runs you do is counted, not the number of venues you turn up to.

Some people suggested additional categories for the superlatives, some of which I have included, as well as the ones you voted on, and the ones there's little controversy over. Maybe all of these will be carried forward until next year(?) See inside to find out more...

There is a new feature on the Inside Back Page - the Composite Hash Guide. There are now at least 5 runs a month somewhere in the Nottingham / Leicester area, and Every Sunday is now a Hash Day!! By the End of March, there will be hashes Every Sunday and Most Mondays somewhere in the Nottingham / Derby / Leicester triangle - averaging 7 or 8 a month. Simple!!

Note the **change of venue** for the next run - it will now be the **Forest Gate**, Loughborough, and not the Griffin. There is a map inside this mighty organ. The last torchlight run this winter will be the **20 a Day run** from the Marquis of Lorne, Radford (again), when we will be visiting (and sampling) some of Nottingham's rich fag-making tradition.
