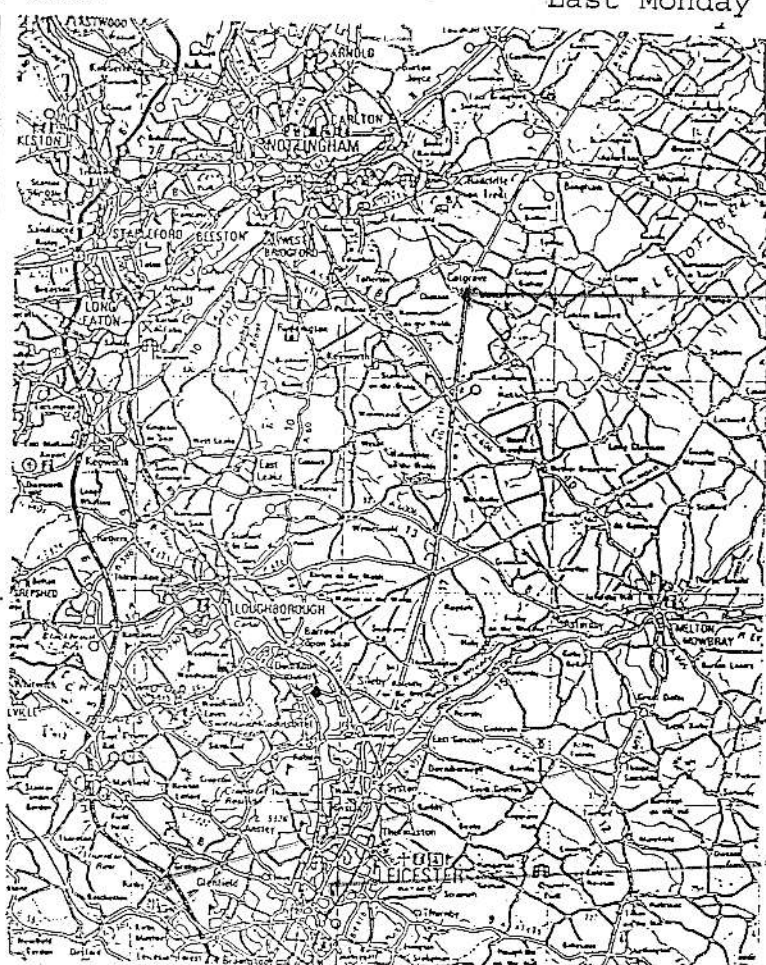

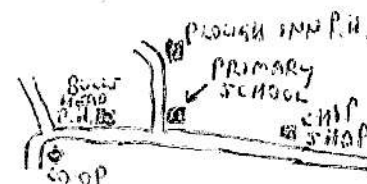

Welcome to yet another edition of Rash Hag. As usual, the backlog of write-ups is creeping up. With three runs a month and only one write-up per month, it all adds up pretty quickly!

As mentioned last month, the **QH3 Hash Party** will be on August 1st, 2nd and 3rd. This will be an Away Weekend at Home, with unlimited supplies of free beer all weekend, Hashes on all three days and all your meals, and plenty of other things thrown in. The house next door is unoccupied, so there's plenty of crash space, plus space for camping. Pick-ups can be arranged from the railway and bus stations, so there's no need to worry about drinking and driving. I'm assured it's in full swing!!

Run numbers are of course flexible

The Monday Night Run in August will be held on **Monday 1st September**. This is because the last Monday in August is a Bonk Holiday, and also a lot of us will still be knackered from Nash Hash. Also of course please note the Monday Run this month is on a Wednesday, July 30th. Speaking of Nash Hash, where would you like it to go in 1999? There is a joint South Wales Bid from Cardiff H3 and Mountin' Sheep H3, plus a joint scottish bid. There may be some other last minute surprise bids (don't worry - not from QH3!!) So... would you prefer to hash in the Cairngorms or the Brecon Beacons?? If you are likely to go to Nash Hash '99 and have any opinion on this matter, please see Too Tuf, as QH3 will have a vote at Nash Hash.

Your Edit-Hare will also be laying an MH3 Hash at the **White Hart, Stanley** (again!), on **Monday 11th August**. This pub serves wonderful fish and chips on Monday Nights, and you'll love the toilets!

The Croniford Hash (as far as I know - I've just come back from my hols!) is still on. There will be a coach, with pick-up points at Leicester Bus Station, Nottingham Broad Marsh Bus Station and Derby Bus Station. Precisely where the pick-up points are will of course depend on who goes (we could have pick-up points in Barrow Upon Soar, Keyworth, Beeston...) If you are interested in hashing in virgin Hash Territory (I think) please shout as soon as possible.

There are also further details in this Rag about Interhash '98, Lundy Island, Norfolk 700th and Elgin 700th. Happy reading! Please note the venue for Berkshire is Rushall Manor Farm (Grid reference 584723) If you want to know where that is, please see me. 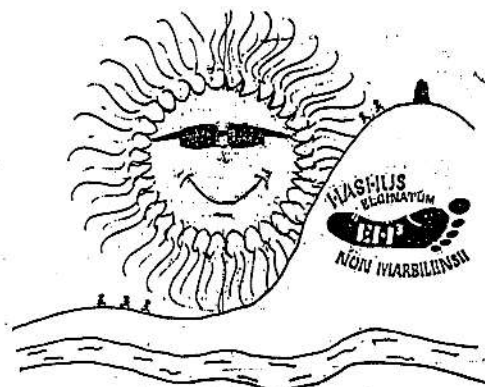

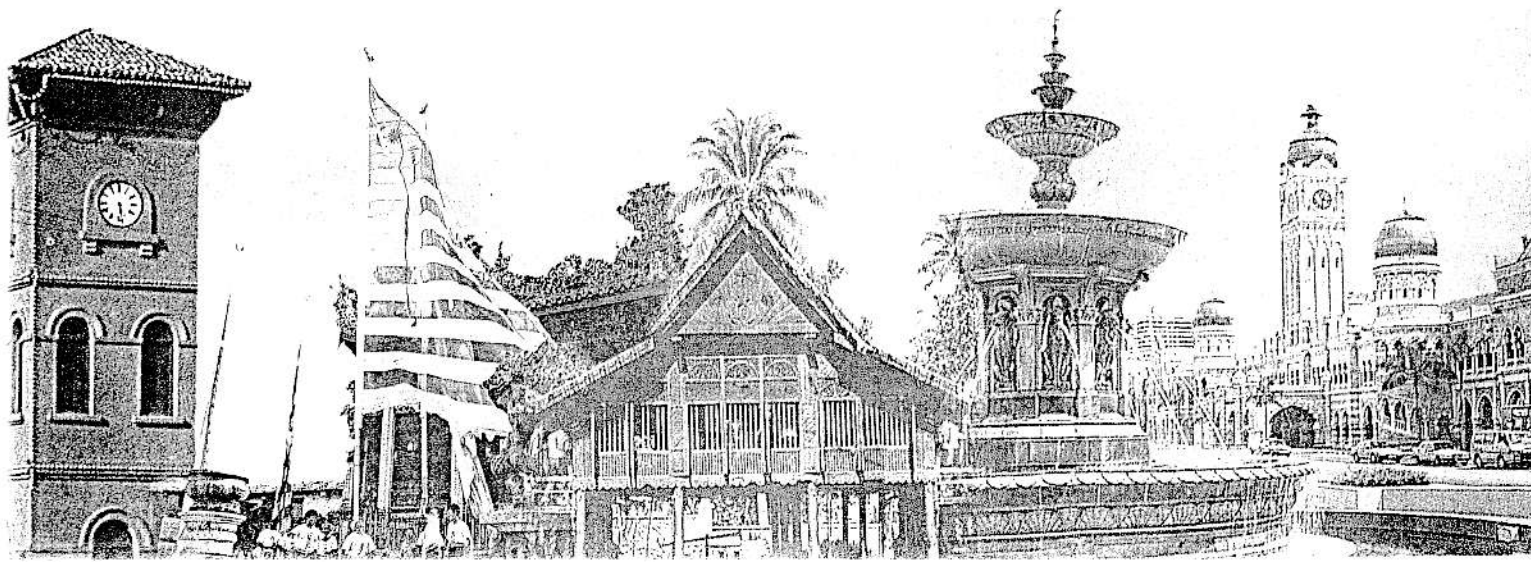

We are not really surprised by the response as we expected this hash 60th birthday Homecoming Interhash to be the biggest and best Interhash in history. This is why we have nine hash chapters from Kuala Lumpur and Petaling Jaya, with some 1500 hashers, playing hosts to this Interhash and all are represented on the Mismanagement Committee. Perhaps, it is also another way of ensuring that there will be enough people to share the shits if things screw up!!



## THE VENUE

The venue is the historical MERDEKA STADIUM right in the centre of Kuala Lumpur City which hosted Malaysia's Independence Day ceremony in 1957 and will witness its last event with the hosting of Interhash '98. After that it will be demolished to make way for a new complex. How else would the government clear up the mess after Interhash '98 but to tear it down completely and rebuild it from scratch?? This venue is located near the main railway and bus stations and is within walking distance of many hotels, restaurants, pubs and places of interest. Anyway, not to worry, as by then getting around Kuala Lumpur will be even easier as our rapid transit rail system will be finished in time for The Commonwealth Games in September '98.

### Preamble and Post Interhash activities

You can expect a hash run any day of the week. We will also try to organise a family run on Sunday before the Interhash weekend. Some of the events being planned are:

Post Interhash Bash in the North, likely to be in Penang or Langkawi with Preamble bash in Singapore.

On the Thursday (2nd Oct'98) before registration, there will be T-shirt run hosted by the Petaling Jaya Hazards and Petaling Jaya Harriettes. Separate runs for men and women, with a common bash after the runs. No, it is not for religious reasons, just the tradition of the Hazards.
