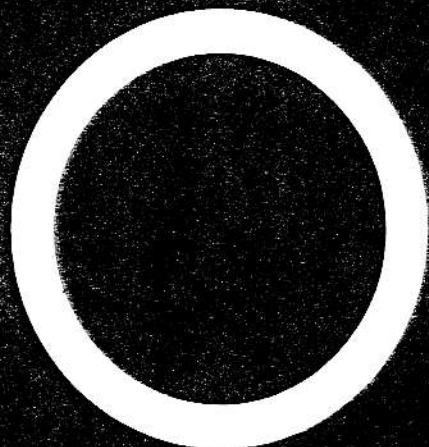

Marcus Attilius Regulus – Placed inside a barrel studded with nails and spikes, then rolled down a hill !

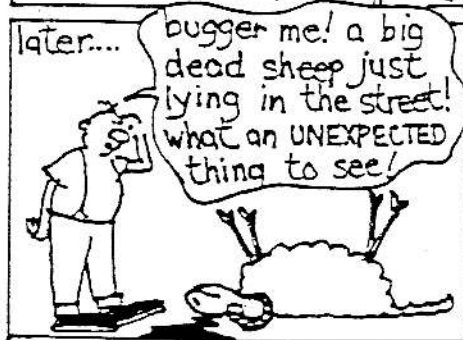
Aeschylus – An eagle dropped a tortoise on his head killing him

Euripides – Attacked by pack of hunting dogs belonging to the Emperor.

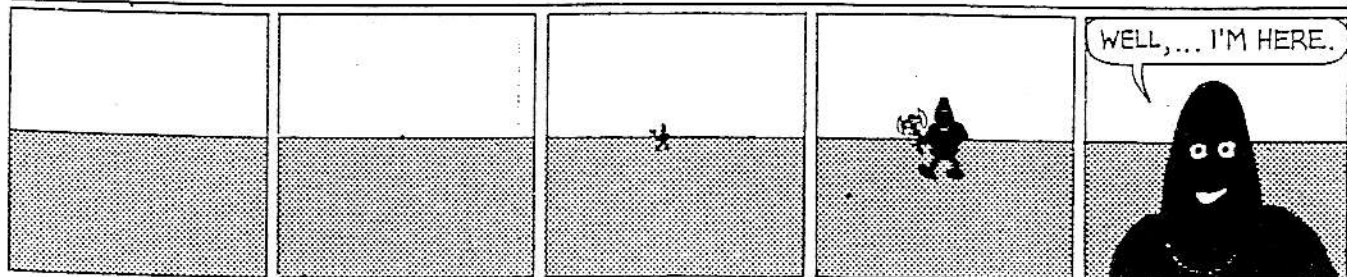

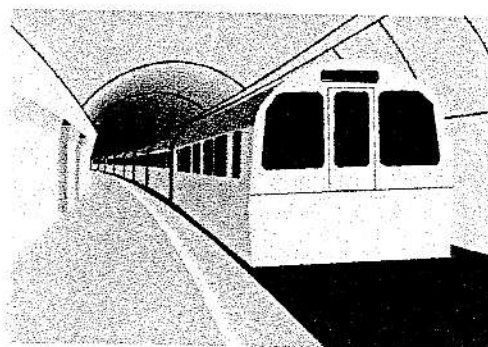
