BH3 Trip to the Czech Republic

Dates: Saturday 19 September to Sunday 27 September - or thereabouts...

June 1998

Due to popular request there will be a hash trip to the Czech Republic during September. The trip will generally comprise around 3 days in Prague (say Sat, Sun, Mon +Fri night for early fliers) and around 5-6 days in the Giant mountains on the Czech / Polish border (i.e. the rest of the week). The Prague weekend is mainly to satisfy the long-weekenders, and the mountains is too satisfy those with a yearning for the outdoor life. There will be a hash in the Prague area on the Sunday (with Prague H3), and one in the mountains on the Wednesday (and perhaps a bike hash). There can be day excursions arranged to other places. It will be fairly flexible to suit all needs.

Travel

- There are generally, two sensible ways to get there :-

1) Fly : BA, CSA and British Midland all fly to Prague from several airports. Approx. £200 return per person

2) Drive: It seems a long way (c. 850 miles Reading to Prague) but can be driven in around 15 to 18 hours, depending upon how many stops, speed etc. It can be done for around £200 including the ferry (less for a diesel car), which works out quite cheap per person for a car loud.

Money -The local currency is the Czech Koruna (crown), which at the moment is around Kr50 = £1.00. You cannot buy the currency before you leave, so take sterling. Deutsch Marks or travellers cheques (the least favoured of the three). Personally, I always take sterling, but whatever you want. There are plenty of places to change money, and many places will accept DM's. It is probably better to change money as you need it, in my experience you actually need less than you think... A beer will probably cost you Kr15 to 50 (at the trendy tourist places), and meals are reasonably priced. Outside of Prague you are unlikely to spend more than Kr 300 for a 3 course meal and drinks. Note: Generally, only the main hotels and restaurants will accept credit cards.

Accommodation - Hotels are reasonable priced, although Prague is a city full of tourists and some prices are as in the West.

We plan to stay in the Hostivice on the western edge of Prague, behind the airport (c. 10km 1) Prague : round by road). It is approx. 10-12 km out of the city centre, which is within easy reach by train, bus, taxi or car. There are two hotels to suit all pockets:

a) Hotel Fort Roxy (***)(20 rooms) - A modern hotel with everything to make your stay comfortable (satellite tv, en-suite showers etc..)

Prices: (last December) around Kr1500 per night for a single person in a room, c.Kr2000 for 2 people, Kr2250 for 3, Kr2500 for 4 - all bed & breakfast - they take credit cards and most currencies.

- b) Hotel Chmclovy Ker (hop plant...)(17 rooms) A slightly more down market hotel, most rooms have a shower but not a loo (it's in the corridor). It reminds me a bit of the Neuadd Arms. Prices: Kr450 per person per night for B&B.
- 2) Mountains (Benecko): We'll be staying at the same hotel as the Christmas trip (ask Motox or anyone else who was there). It is a good family run hotel, with bars which close when the last man leaves, and is approx. 100km NE of Prague near the Polish border. It is around 1.5 hour drive from Prague (c. Kr2000 by taxi) or 3-4 hours by bus (c. Kr100). It is set in very good hashing country, and ideal for mountain biking (available locally to hire), walking etc.

Hotel: Martinova Bouda (10 rooms - 27 bods)

Prices: DM19 for B&B, DM23 for half board, DM27 for full board per person per day (pay in DM). I would recommend half board (breakfast + evening meal), we will be too busy for full board!

Well, there you have it. It will be a good week of travel, culture and hashing. See the country before it changes too much


An elderly man was walking through the French countryside, admiring the beautiful spring day, when over a hedgerow he spotted a young couple making love in a field.


